
How to be an ally?

As allies, you are indispensable to the journey of transgender people. Without you, theirs would be a very lonely road. So, you can be an "ally" by helping your trans friends in the following ways:

- Accept the right of trans people to define their own gender and respect that identification.
- Ask for pronouns before addressing your trans friends. Realize that you could make mistakes sometimes, but know to apologize and ask for guidance.
- Learn and use gender-neutral pronouns or no pronouns in conversations with your trans friends.
- Know which questions are good to ask and which are off-limits.
- Challenge anti-trans and sexist remarks, jokes and comments in the public space.
- Listen to the stories of your trans friends and understand their experiences.
- Say that you are a trans "ally" and why.

Public Figures and Media



Marsha P. Johnson

Marsha P. Johnson was an American gay liberation activist and a prominent face of the Stonewall Riots of 1969. She co-founded the Gay Liberation Front and the transvestite advocacy organisation S.T.A.R. Johnson was known among the LGBTQ+ community in New York as the "Mayor of Christopher Street". Her popularity led to Andy Warhol commissioning a portrait of hers. In 2017, Netflix released a documentary in her memory, "The Death and Life of Marsha P. Johnson".



Sylvia Rivera

Sylvia Rivera was a gay liberation and transgender rights activist. She co-founded the Gay Liberation Front and the S.T.A.R. with Johnson. She is also known as the "Rosa Parks of the Transgender movement". The "Sylvia Rivera Law Project", named in her honor, provides legal aid to low-income gender non-conforming persons of color.

Laverne Cox and oitnb

Laverne Cox is an actress and LGBT activist. Since 2013, she plays the role of a transgender prison inmate Sophia Burset in the Netflix original series Orange is the new Black.





Trans* Identities

MtF Transgender

(Male to Fernale):
A woman who was assigned male at birth but who identifies as a female.

FtM Transgender

(Fernale to Male): A man who was assigned female at birth but who identifies as a male.

GenderQueer:

One who identifies outside the gender binary, can include identities like genderfluid.

Third Gender:

Term often used in anthropological studies to set apart identities other than man or woman that appear across different cultures (e.g. two spirit).

Agender:

Not identifying with any gender, the feeling of having no gender. proncuns guide

TERMINOLOGY

a gender-variant umbrella

SEX: "What's between your legs." Sex has to do with your chromosomes, genitalia, hormones, etc

GENDER: 'What's between your ears." Gender has to do with your internal sense of self.

GENDER EXPRESSION:

How you express your gender (masculine, feminine, androgynous, neither, etc)

SEXUAL ORIENTATION:

What you are attracted to (lesbian, gay, straight, bisexual, pansexual, queer, asexual); does NOT correlate with gender or sex.

Hote: All of these terms are relative.
They can vary from individual to
individual, can overlap, change over time,
and contingent upon personal wage...
